

12	<p><i>Local Government project Report; Casa Grande, Coolidge, Eloy, Pinal County</i></p> <p><i>Casa Grande - The City is looking at utilizing 5307 FTA funds for bus shelters and bus stops for the CART program. It has been determined to reduce the scope of work for the Rock N' Roll SRTS project in order to keep the project moving forward. The Pedestrian and APS project is waiting on an IGA from ADOT. The City is considering the installation of beacons (strobe lights) at pedestrian crossings in Casa Grande. These would be funded with local funds.</i></p> <p><i>Coolidge - The Coolidge Ave. project is complete - just waiting on the punch list to be completed. The Central Ave. (STP/TE) projects are programmed for construction this FY and Susanna would like some follow-up with the EPG Section that the clearance will be issued within a reasonable timeframe. Eric Boyles will follow-up with EPG. Main St. design is moving forward. The HSIP Pavement Marking Upgrade project is completed. The City has received and are installing the 2,800 HSIP funded signs.</i></p> <p><i>Eloy - Lance provided an update on many local projects including Shedd Rd and slurry seal project. The Main St. project is moving forward. Kittleson met with staff to review concept and will be meeting with the City Council in January. The November election brought new party control to the U.S. Senate and new leadership to the Governor's Office and State House. Many new faces will be steering the direction of public policy. However, they will have to contend with many of the substantial obstacles that confronted their predecessors.

In Washington, the revenue streams that pay for our highway and transit systems are only covering about two-thirds of their costs. Resolving that gap must be done through a growingly divided split government more often than not plagued with partisan paralysis and also somewhat in conflict with either reducing federal deficit spending or not raising taxes.

In Arizona, state highway revenue collections are still far below previous levels and state lawmakers continue to transfer more of that money away from transportation construction and maintenance. We have seen improvements as the transfers have diminished considerably over the last three years, but that trend will be challenged as substantial state budget deficits are anticipated for the current and at least the next three years.

As lawmakers continue to prioritize economic recovery, it is incumbent upon us to educate both them and the public on the link between infrastructure investment and economic growth. Our construction industry, historically one of the largest employment sectors in Arizona, has not yet recovered from the recession and could certainly use a boost from more highway and road projects. Also, Arizona is strategically located to compete for interstate and international trade with some of the largest and fastest emerging economies in the world but must have adequate infrastructure capacity to do so successfully. We can also not forget the impact that quality infrastructure has on public safety, the environment, cost of living and quality of life.


