	<i>Spring 2022 AQ Conformity Analysis - Project lists were submitted to MAG on February 16, 2022. All follow-up questions from MAG have been answered. Today's consent agenda has the approval to advertise for the Public Review and Comment period.</i>		
	<i>Pinal County Update - MAG, Pinal County and the Sun Corridor MPO continue to work on the Serious Area SIP. Work on the West Pinal PM10 Serious Area SIP is almost complete and is preparing to begin public notice. MAG estimated this will occur in March 2022. Once the public notice begins SCMPO will be notified.</i>		
8	Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) Planner Update (Information Only)		
	<i>Irene Higgs provided the following update:</i>		
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> The HSIP call for projects for the FY25-26 program years was released February 28. There are changes in this year's application process; one in particular is the mandatory review of all applications prior to final submission. The review is required for the final application to be accepted. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Draft applications are due for review April 29. Final applications are due July 1. March 9, 10:00-11:30 the HSIP Group will be hosting a webinar to go through the new application process. March 18, 2022, the Tentative FY23-FY27 ADOT 5 Year Construction Program will be posted and the Public comment period will begin. At the last Executive Board meeting the region showed interest in Electric Vehicle charging stations. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill includes \$7.5 billion in dedicated funding for EV charging stations. However, in order for the state to access the available funds to Arizona, the state must develop and submit an EV Infrastructure Deployment Plan by August 1, 2022. ADOT Leadership is deciding on the plan and direction in developing the plan. After decisions are made, all the COG's and MPO's will be contacted and included. There are two discretionary Grant Programs to support EV charger deployments. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> \$1.25B Corridor Charging Grant Program \$1.25B Community Charging Grant Program

	<p>ADOT studies:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The 2050 ADOT Long Range Transportation Plan was advertised March 2. P2P GIS Project: Comments for the Draft Data Governance & Maintenance Plan were submitted to the Consultant and are being incorporated into the project. Results of the GIS Tool's Predictive Analysis will be included in future P2P Process beginning the next cycle. 3. State Freight Plan: Freight Advisory Committee Meeting was held February 22, 2022. One topic that was discussed was identifying freight bottlenecks on an interactive map that was introduced by Kittleson. The deadline to review and submit freight bottleneck locations is Tuesday, March 8, 2022. 4. Statewide Overhead Traffic Sign Structure Study: The consultant is currently reviewing data to develop the base inventory and organize structures for prioritization. The next progress meeting will occur in March. 5. Statewide Rest Area Study: Data collection has started and will continue through March and April.
9	<p>Federal Highways Administration (FHWA) Update (Information Only)</p> <p><i>Ed Stillings provided the following update:</i></p> <p>FHWA Arizona Division Office will be back full-time in the office starting on April 25, 2022. The Continuing Resolution is set to expire on March 11, 2022. Need full appropriation approval to enact any new funds in the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.</p> <p>Electric Vehicle (EV) Plan - ADOT will hire a consultant to work on EV Plan. Ed Stillings will be the FHWA Representative for the EV Plan. The Interstate System is the number one priority for EV Charging Stations. Once Interstates are compliant, EV Charging will expand to other NHS Routes.</p> <p>Mayor Craig McFarland asked if anyone is working with gas stations (e.g. Circle K etc.) in installing EV Charging stations at a Federal level. Irene Higgs stated that gas stations are listed as stakeholders in the Federal Guidelines for the State EV Plan. Ed Stillings stated that he will reach out to his Washington contact to check.</p>
10	<p>ADOT Southcentral District Engineer Update (Information Only)</p> <p><i>Doug Moseke provided an update on all ADOT projects within the region.</i></p> <p>Mayor McFarland asked ADOT if truck traffic on I-10 could be restricted to the right lane from Casa Grande to Chandler. Rod Lane stated that ADOT had looked at it before and will look at it again. Doug Moseke will get back to Mayor McFarland. Mayor McFarland also asked if there is a central location for all the documents for the I-10 Widening Project (e.g. available funding for project)? Irene Higgs stated that there is a website for the study and Doug Moseke said he will provide the link to the Mayor. Irene Higgs stated that she will pull together a breakdown of potential and available funding and send it to Mayor McFarland prior to the next meeting.</p>

It was later discovered/discuss that this was not true and the Arizona Supreme Court did not rule in favor of the Pinal RTA. There is currently \$80 million in the escrow account.</p>
12	<p>I-10 Widening Update (Information Only)</p> <p><i>Irene Higgs provided the following update to the I-10 Widening Study:</i></p> <p>A Public Hearing is planned for summer 2022. On March 2, 2022 Senator Kelly addresses roadway construction needs for the widening of I-10 and future I-11 during a Senate Environment and Public Works Committee hearing on the implementation of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.</p>
13	<p>BUILD Grant Update - Inland Port Arizona (Information Only)</p> <p><i>Jason Bottjen provided the following update:</i></p> <p>Final plans were approved by FHWA in late January. The Amended Grant Agreement which includes the construction phase was approved by FHWA on February 3rd. UPRR Crossing Agreement approved at the BOS on February 23. Received conditional ROW clearance on February 23 and conditional utility clearance on March 4 from FHWA. FHWA has reviewed the construction solicitation documents and we received approval to advertise on March 4th. Land acquisition is nearly complete with affected property owners. SUBJECT: MPO Update

Progress Report - Below is a listing of some of the activities staff attended for the months of March, April and a portion of May. Staff also prepared documentation for monthly ADOT reimbursement invoicing, attended various meetings with consultants, and general business activities for the MPO.

The Sun Corridor Metropolitan Planning Organization is proud to submit this letter supporting the I-10/Kortsen Traffic Interchange in Casa Grande, Arizona, for a 2022 Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant. This project will improve transportation access for newly emerging industries in south-central **Arizona's Gateway to the Electric Vehicle Future**. Lucid Motors has constructed a plant that will produce tens of thousands of electric vehicles annually in Casa Grande, while Nikola will do the same for electric trucks in neighboring Coolidge.

Lucid and Nikola selected south-central Arizona to help shape the electric vehicle future due to access to transportation infrastructure including; Interstate Highways 8 and 10, nearby rail service to obtain parts made in Mexico, and convenient access to Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport. The location is logical for resiliency-related reasons as well, being safe from most climate-related disasters.

While the proximity of Interstate Highways and railroad lines is ideal, additional help is needed to ensure that the local roadway system can handle the transportation demands that will quickly increase due to the recently opened Lucid plant, the Nikola plant that is under construction, and many supporting businesses that will soon be opening in the region. Adding a new I-10 interchange at Kortsen Road will help to balance out traffic on the regional arterial street system to avoid overloading roadways that do have access, specifically Florence Boulevard and McCartney Road.

In addition to creating jobs in the community, the project will add a sidewalk and bike lanes to accommodate non-motorized transportation across I-10. Casa Grande's voter-approved June 2021 Comprehensive Plan update emphasizes alternative transportation modes.

There is strong support for this project by many levels of government and a wide variety of stakeholder agencies, but the most crucial support comes from the people themselves. In November 2017, the voters of Pinal County approved a half-cent sales tax to pay for specified elements of the Pinal Regional Transportation Plan, including substantial funding for this interchange and its connecting roadways.

In summary, the I-10/Kortsen Road Traffic Interchange project will result in significant progress towards meeting local, regional and national goals for advancing economic progress sustainably and equitably. This letter is presented to express our strong support for the RAISE grant application for the proposed Central Arizona Parkway in Pinal County, Arizona.

The Central Arizona Parkway will be a new high-capacity roadway facility that will connect the region's growing communities and industrial developments to the existing freeway network, including the newly extended State Route (SR) 24, SR 202, Interstate 10, and United States Route (US) 60. The first phase of the parkway is four miles long and will connect the SR 24 extension to Ocotillo Road. The parkway will ultimately extend another nine miles south to Arizona Farms Road and the future North-South Freeway.

The Central Arizona Parkway is located within the Sun Corridor region, a linear area of high population density anchored by Tucson and Phoenix. More than 80 percent (6 million) of Arizonans currently live within that "megaregion," which is expected to grow to nearly 9 million people by 2040. Section IV.h of the Charter for Performance Measure, Target Setting and Data Sharing signed by Sun Corridor MPO and ADOT in July 2018 states that:

SCMPO will annually complete an evaluation to determine if a transportation provider has been established. Once a transportation provider has been established, the PARTIES will execute a new Charter with the transportation provider to specify that the transportation provider will establish transit asset management, safety and other required transit performance targets and share established targets with the PARTIES; will share with the PARTIES data obtained or collected in support of performance measure tracking upon request; will provide an outline of the adoption process to the PARTIES once established; and will report performance targets to FTA.

The City of Casa Grande has been designated by FTA as a direct recipient of 5307 funding and therefore it is necessary to execute a new Charter, as outlined in section IV.h of the current Charter.

The purpose of this Charter between Sun Corridor MPO, Casa Grande and ADOT is to jointly agree upon and develop specific written provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to transportation performance data, the establishment of performance targets, the reporting of performance targets, the reporting of performance measures to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the Sun Corridor MPO region, and the collection of data for the State management plan for the National Highway System (NHS).

As outlined in the agreement, Sun Corridor MPO will:

- Establish necessary transportation performance targets or adopt ADOT performance targets.
- Share with ADOT data obtained in support of the performance measures.
- Approve the established targets through the Technical Advisory Committee and Executive Board.
- Adopt transit performance targets established by the Casa Grande Public Transportation Authority (CGPTA).

- Adopt ADOT transit performance targets for the rural areas of the SCMPO.
 - Report performance targets to FHWA and FTA (if necessary).
 - Prepare a System Performance Report as part of the RTP update.
 - Include a description of anticipated impact of projects upon the performance targets in the TIP.
 - Include a linkage from investment priorities in the TIP.

This Charter is made and entered into by and among ADOT as the Designated Recipient for Federal formula funds in the non-urbanized areas, S C M P O as the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization, and CGPTP as the provider of public transportation and the Direct Recipient for Federal formula funds in the urbanized areas, referred to collectively as the "PARTIES" or individually as a "PARTY".

This Charter is effective as of the date it has been approved by all PARTIES.

I. Purpose of the Memorandum of Understanding

SCMPO, ADOT, and CGPTP agree upon these specific written provisions for cooperatively developing and sharing information related to transportation performance data, the establishment of performance targets, the reporting of performance targets, the reporting of performance measures to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the SCMPO region, and the collection of data for the State asset management plan for the National Highway System.

This Charter is pursuant to planning agreement requirements for performance based planning as defined in applicable federal regulations (see 23 CFR Part 450.314(h)(1) and 23 CFR Part 450.314(h)(2)(ii)). Provisions outlined within this Charter do not modify or replace those outlined in other agreements between PARTIES.

II. Responsibilities of All Parties Pertaining to Target Setting & Data Sharing

- a. All PARTIES acknowledge and agree to implement performance based planning in accord with applicable federal regulations 23 CFR part 450, 23 CFR 490, 49 CFR 625 and 49 CFR 673.
- b. The PARTIES will coordinate on the establishment of targets to ensure consistency, to the maximum extent practicable.
- c. The PARTIES will adopt performance targets for the metropolitan transportation planning process in accordance with Federal and State requirements.
- d. The PARTIES will ensure any of their respective reporting of targets and performance will conform to applicable federal regulations.
- e. Non-Unified targets are required to be established by ADOT, and SCMPO will have the option to agree and adopt them or calculate and establish SCMPO-specific targets.

III. Responsibilities of the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT)

- a. ADOT will develop draft statewide required performance targets in coordination with SCMPO, as applicable. Coordination may include in-person meetings, web meetings, conference calls, and/or email communication. ADOT will provide SCMPO with a reasonable opportunity to provide comments on statewide targets prior to the adoption of final statewide targets.
- b. ADOT will take action necessary to meet all State and Federal laws required as related to Performance Based Planning and Programming and will involve Parties as necessary and appropriate.
- c. Upon request, and when not contractually prohibited, ADOT will share with the PARTIES data obtained or collected to support the development of statewide targets and in support of ongoing performance measure tracking.
- d. ADOT will report its performance targets to FHWA and FTA, as applicable. A copy of the report will be sent to the PARTIES at that time.
- e. ADOT will be responsible for collecting bridge and pavement condition data. The data will be used for but not limited to creation of the State Asset Management Plan for the National Highway System. Safety and other data to be collected as required.
- f. To the maximum extent practicable, ADOT will include in its State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) a description of the anticipated effect of the STIP toward achieving previously established and agreed upon performance targets.
- g. ADOT's STIP will include a linkage from the investment priorities in the STIP to achievement of previously established and agreed upon performance targets.

IV. Responsibilities of the Sun Corridor Metropolitan Planning Organization (SCMPO)

- a. SCMPO, when it has not adopted State targets, will develop quantifiable targets for performance measures and will share documentation pertaining to the development, reporting and tracking of those targets with the PARTIES.
- b. Upon request, and when not contractually prohibited, SCMPO will share with the PARTIES data obtained or collected in support of performance measure tracking.
- c. The establishment of targets will be developed by the SCMPO Technical Advisory Committee with final approval by the SCMPO Executive Board.
 - (1) SCMPO will receive CGPTP performance targets for transit asset management, safety and other required transit performance targets for the urban transit program and, barring a substantive reason, recommend them for adoption as the SCMPO target.
 - (2) SCMPO will receive ADOT performance targets for the rural areas and, barring a substantive reason, recommend them for adoption as the SCMPO target.
- d. SCMPO will report its performance targets to FHWA and FTA, as applicable. A copy of all reports will be sent to the PARTIES at that time.
- e. SCMPO will, by reference in the RTP, prepare a System Performance Report to report the condition and performance of the transportation system with respect to performance targets, including progress achieved by SCMPO toward the previously established and agreed upon performance targets.
- f. To the maximum extent practicable, SCMPO will include in its Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) a description of the anticipated effect of the TIP toward achieving previously established and agreed upon performance targets.
- g. SCMPO's TIP will include a linkage from the investment priorities in the TIP to

achievement of previously established and agreed upon performance targets.

V. Responsibilities of the Casa Grande Public Transportation Provider (CGPTP)

- a. CGPTP will establish transit asset management, safety and other required transit performance targets and share established targets with the PARTIES.
- b. Upon request, and when not contractually prohibited, the CGPTP will share with the PARTIES data obtained or collected in support of performance measure tracking.
- c. CGPTP will develop the measures as follows.
 - i. The TAM, safety and other required performance targets will be developed through the CGPTP committee process. The CGPTP City Council, as the governing and policy-making bodies for CGPTP, will take final action.
- d. CGPTP will report performance targets to SCMPO and ADOT. A copy of all reports will be sent to the PARTIES at that time.

VI. Conflict Resolution section

If disagreements arise regarding the implementation of this Charter, all PARTIES will act in good faith to resolve the disagreement. If a resolution cannot be reached, the PARTIES to this agreement agree to meet and have a representative from the Federal Highway Administration or the Federal Transit Administration to assist in resolving the disagreement. In the event a resolution still cannot be reached, the parties hereto agree to abide by required arbitration as set forth for public works in Agreement in Arizona Revised Statutes Section 12-1518

VII. Term

This Charter will remain in full force and effect until it is terminated in writing by one or all of the PARTIES, whichever date occurs first.







Regional Funding – Sun Corridor MPO staff anticipates an excess of Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBG) funds in the amount of \$36,577 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2022. These funds will be applied to the Pinal County I-10 Detour Plan, pending TAC and Executive Board approval.

Sun Corridor MPO staff is currently working with the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) Financial Management Services (FMS) to work out the details of the loan.

- If approved, SCMPO would provide ADOT with \$36,577 of STBG funds in FY22. ADOT would provide SCMPO with \$36,577 of STBG funds in FY23.

Once all FY22 closeout funds are identified, Sun Corridor MPO staff will finalize the amount of funds to be included in the loan, complete the loan paperwork, and submit to ADOT for final approval.

The Sun Corridor MPO staff recommends that a loan be approved between Sun Corridor MPO and ADOT for FY22 STBG funds.

Approved transfer/loan requests must be received by June 15th each year; allow two weeks for approval. Transfers generally will appear on the next ledger, depending on the date of receipt.

This request will be processed based on the amount of apportionments and obligation authority available to the loaning/transferring agency at the time of receipt, which may be different than the amount shown on the most recent ledger. Loans are to be repaid; transfers will not be repaid.

Loans of apportionments and/or obligation authority to ADOT- these loans are not guaranteed; are capped at a total, maximum of \$10 million annually; are limited to greater Arizona STP projects in a TIP which exceed the region's available STP allocation; will be on a first come, first served basis if available; require advance approval. Every effort should be made to reprogram federal funds on projects ready to authorize by June 30th annually or to loan to other regional entities before approaching ADOT about a loan. Loans to ADOT must be approved and executed by March 31st annually.

SUBJECT: Discussion and Possible Action to Adopt Resolution 2022-01 for the Pinal County Serious Area Particulate Plan for PM-10

In accordance with the Clean Air Act, the Draft Serious Area Particulate Plan for PM-10 for the West Pinal County Nonattainment Area has been prepared for submittal to the Environmental Protection Agency. The draft plan contains a broad range of committed Best Available Control Measures (BACM) and Most Stringent Measures (MSM) to reduce PM-10 from a variety of emission sources. The plan includes a request for an extension of the attainment date to December 31, 2026 and demonstrates attainment of the PM-10 standard by that date.

On March 21 and 22, 2022, Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) published a public notice to provide an opportunity to comment on and/or request a public hearing on the draft plan by April 20, 2022. No comments were received by the due date on the draft plan, however one request for an extension was granted by MAG. Any comments will be addressed prior to Executive Board approval. The MAG Regional Council may take action on the plan on May 25, 2022.

Sun Corridor MPO staff recommends the adoption of Resolution 2022-01 for the Serious Area Particulate Plan for PM-10 in Pinal County.

RESOLUTION OF THE SUN CORRIDOR METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION (MPO), PINAL COUNTY, ARIZONA TO ADOPT THE 2022 SERIOUS AREA PARTICULATE PLAN FOR PM-10 FOR THE WEST PINAL COUNTY NONATTAINMENT AREA

WHEREAS, the Sun Corridor MPO is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Casa Grande urbanized area and surrounding area including the City of Casa Grande, the City of Coolidge, the City of Eloy and portions of unincorporated Pinal County; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of Arizona designated the Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) as the regional air quality planning agency for all jurisdictions in Maricopa County, including the Phoenix urbanized area and the contiguous urbanized area in Pinal County, including the Town of Florence and City of Maricopa; and

WHEREAS, Sun Corridor MPO and MAG entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for MAG to provide assistance to Sun Corridor MPO by preparing conformity analyses for the West Pinal County PM-10 nonattainment area; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Protection Agency reclassified the West Pinal County PM-10 nonattainment area as a Serious Area for PM-10 in 2020 in accordance with the Clean Air Act; and

WHEREAS, the 2022 Serious Area Particulate Plan for PM-10 for the West Pinal County Nonattainment Area is required by the Clean Air Act since the area failed to attain the PM-10 standard by December 31, 2018; and

WHEREAS, MAG has prepared the 2022 Serious Area Particulate Plan for PM-10 for the West Pinal County Nonattainment Area in cooperation with the Sun Corridor Metropolitan Planning Organization; and

WHEREAS, A.R.S. 49-406(H) requires that the governing body of the metropolitan planning organization adopt the nonattainment area plan.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SUN CORRIDOR METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION as follows:

SECTION 1. That the Sun Corridor MPO Executive Board adopts the 2022 Serious Area Particulate Plan for PM-10 for the West Pinal County Nonattainment Area.

SECTION 2. That the Sun Corridor MPO Executive Board authorizes the submission of the plan to the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.
