1	Call to Order and Introductions The meeting was called to order by Chairman Craig McFarland at 10:10 A.M.
2	Title VI - Notice to the Public SCMPO Executive Director, Irene Higgs, read the Title VI Public Notice.

4	Discussion and Possible Action to add Jenny Howard as the Sun Corridor MPO Executive Board representative for the ADOT State Transportation Board Member (Pinal, Gila, and Graham Counties - District 4) A motion was made by Vice-Chairman Jon Thompson to add Jenny Howard as the Sun Corridor MPO Executive Board representative for the ADOT State Transportation Board Member (Pinal, Gila, and Graham Counties - District 4). The motion was seconded by Board Member Rod Lane.
5	ADOT Title VI Training (Presentation) Sara Martinez, ADOT Civil Rights Office, provided Title VI Training.
6	1-10 Widening Project Update (Presentation) Greg Byres, ADOT State Engineer, provided an update to the 1-10 Widening Project.
7	Regional Transportation Advocacy Council (RTAC) (Information Only) Irene Higgs provided the following update: The big legislative news is that HB2543 passed the House 50-8 last week. It has not been assigned to Senate Committees yet although we are highly anticipating Transportation & Technology and Appropriations assignments and the strong possibility that they will be scheduled for hearings on March 20th and 21st. Kevin Adams' last update included the names, phone numbers, and e-mails for all of the committee members.
8	Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC) Update (Information Only): Duane Eitel provided the following update: Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) - The project RTP Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) kicked-off the project on January 26th. Since then, the following has occurred: Performance targets discussed at the TAC meeting were amended to incorporate new transit targets. A summary of all targets was transmitted to ADOT for the TAC review. ADOT confirmed that all targets were correct. The project team transmitted data requests to the TAC. Some data has been received. Still awaiting some GIS datasets. A comprehensive list of potential project stakeholders was identified at the TAC meeting. The project team has reached out to the Public Information Offices at both the City of Casa Grande and Pinal County regarding a potential existing stakeholder list. One is available from the City of Casa Grande. The comprehensive list of stakeholders was also refined to identify priorities for interviews. These interviews will be scheduled in March and include transit, freight, aviation, housing, emergency response, environmental, Az State Land and Department representatives. The project team will also be meeting with economic development and planning representatives from each member agency. The Public Involvement Plan (PIP) is under development. The draft plan has been reviewed by SCMPO staff and comments were provided. The Consultant is finalizing the PIP. The study webpage is up and running. Currently there is an active survey link that allows the public to provide feedback on their transportation priorities and help guide the region's transportation investment decisions. Pinal County Safety Plan/SCMPO Network Screening Crash and Analysis Tools Update - This project will update the 2019 Pinal County Strategic Transportation Safety Plan (STSP). Funding for this project was awarded by ADOT as part of the Highway Safety Improvement Program applications submitted during the 2019 Pinal County Strategic Transportation Safety Study. Funding must be authorized by June 2023. The Sun Corridor MPO Executive Board approved SCMPO staff to advertise the project, select a consultant, and award a contract for the update at the January 10, 2023, SCMPO Executive Board meeting. The Request for Proposals (RFP) will be advertised and released on Thursday, March 16, 2023. Proposals are due by April 13, 2023. It is expected that the selection committee will review proposals and select a consultant in the last half of April with the Notice to Proceed (NTP) expected in late May.

This includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a list of all unpaved roads under its jurisdiction, including data on length and ADT on each unpaved road segment.</li> <li>• a list of unpaved roads which were paved during the previous year including the total number of unpaved roads miles, ADTs and their respective segments.</li> </ul> <p>The 2022 report is due to Pinal County Air Quality by January 30, 2023.</p> <p>Pinal County Air Quality sent out the preliminary draft West Pinal PM10 nonattainment area general fugitive dust rulemaking. More stringent rules for construction, open areas/vacant lots, unpaved roads, paved roads, etc.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Capacity, stabilization and paving (public unpaved roads) requirements for unpaved roads of 26 or more ADT - paving requirement for each entity (city, county, state) to pave 20% of public unpaved roads with ADT of 26+ annually (up to a max. of 5 miles)</li> <li>• paved road requirements - track out and street sweeping</li> <li>• paved road requirements - track out and street sweeping</li> <li>• recorking requirements (i.e. street sweeping)</li> <li>• reporting requirements - same annual unpaved roads report with additional reporting of paved roads that have unpaved shoulder/medians</li> </ul> <p>Jason Gotsen provided the following update for the Sun Corridor MPO:</p> <p><b>SCMPO Winter 2022 Air Quality Conformity</b> - On February 15, 2023, FHWA and FTA made a new finding of conformity for the MAG and SCMPO planning regions. This includes the West Pinal PM-10 and West Central Pinal PM-2.5 non-attainment areas. A STIP Amendment request related to the new finding of conformity was sent to ADOT MPO on February 21, 2023. The Winter 2022 Air Quality Conformity cycle is now completed.</p> <p><b>SCMPO Spring 2023 Air Quality Conformity</b> - Spring 2023 project lists were received from member agencies in early January, compiled into one project list and submitted to MAG on January 13, 2023. AQ Modelling is underway and SCMPO staff has been working with the MAG AQ &amp; Transportation Modeling sections to address comments received. As part of the Consent Agenda, we will be asking the Executive Board to approve the advertisement of the Air Quality Conformity project list and Conformity Analysis for 30-day public review and comment period (tentatively scheduled for April 20, 2023, through May 20, 2023).</p>
<p>10</p> <p>Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) Planner Update (Information Only)</p>	<p>Will Randolph provided the following update:</p> <p><b>FY24-28 Five Year Construction Program:</b> The FY24-28 Tentative Five Year Construction Program was approved by the AZ State Transportation board on Friday Feb. 17th and is currently available for public comment at <a href="https://azdot.gov/planning/transportation-programming/tentative-five-year-program">https://azdot.gov/planning/transportation-programming/tentative-five-year-program</a>. The FY25-29 P2P call for projects is anticipated for late April.</p> <p><b>The HSIP call for projects for the FY25-26 program:</b> Eligibility letters have been sent to the MPOs by ADOT Traffic Safety Section and provided to MPO for the five year construction plan.</p> <p><b>FY24-25 COG/MPO Work Program:</b> Draft MPO/TMA Work Program Agreements have been sent out to the MPOs for comment. Comments have been sent back to ADOT to finalize the agreements.</p> <p><b>Congressional Direct Spending:</b> A recent webinar took place explaining the programs and submission forms to provide to the Arizona Senators. The forms and deadlines for Senator Kelly and Senator Sinema offices are found at <a href="https://www.kelly.senate.gov/ny24/">https://www.kelly.senate.gov/ny24/</a> (deadline of March 15th) and <a href="https://www.sinema.senate.gov/appropriations">https://www.sinema.senate.gov/appropriations</a> (deadline of March 21st).</p> <p><b>ADOT SMART Program:</b> The SMART program has been placed on hold by the governor's office for the time being. Will monitor and advise once we hear further on this. Please continue to visit the website <a href="https://azdot.gov/planning/grant-coordination/az-smart-fund">https://azdot.gov/planning/grant-coordination/az-smart-fund</a>. Changes in the administration are occurring and there will be a new ADOT director January 30, 2023.</p> <p>ADOT studies:</p> <p><b>Long Range Transportation Plan -</b> The ADOT L RTP Public Survey closed January 4th and was extended past its original date. Over 7800 responses were received. In-person meetings for ADOT took place February/March 2023 and have recently concluded. The city locations for these in-person meetings were Tucson, Phoenix, and Flagstaff. A statewide virtual public meeting had also occurred and was completed, and a L RTP Update was presented to COG/MPO/TMA's Planning Representatives on 1/24/23. The last public participation event will be the L RTP Telephone Town Hall to serve Rural Arizona on 3/22/23 (6 pm to 7 pm). ADOT is aiming for the first draft of the L RTP to be completed in late May. The ADOT L RTP webpage will continue to host the working papers and accompanying summary sheets (2-3 page bullet point reports of said working papers).</p> <p>March 23, 2023 the draft-final report is posted on the project website for TAC/Stakeholder and Public comment. Review comments were due to the consultant on February 27th. March 6, 2023 -</p> <p><b>Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Plan:</b> The EV plan was approved in September, and the final rulemaking in regards to EV implementation from the Joint Office of Energy and Transportation was released Feb. 15th. ADOT will continue to meet with stakeholders, vendors, and have further public involvement meetings. Topics covered so far include the program vision and priorities, possible funding options, peer state DOT interviews, program application administration, and project selection criteria. Please contact the ADOT PM Bret Anderson with any additional questions.</p> <p>Other technical studies have been completed including the Overhead Traffic Sign Structure Study, with new ones underway with the ADOT ROW Wireless Communications Facilities Program Guidelines Study and the Statewide ITS Architecture Update.</p>

Temporary public-interest waiver to waive Buy-America requirements in electric vehicle chargers until July 1, 2024 to allow US to ramp up manufacturing of EV components domestically.</li> <li>• Feb 28, 2023 National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Standards and Requirements was published. This final rule establishes setting minimum standards and requirements for projects funded under the national Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Formula Program and EV charging infrastructure. Standards apply to installation, operation and maintenance of EV charging infrastructure. project on a Federal-aid highway. Advertisement scheduled for April 2023.</li> <li>• SR87 and Skousen Road - Install turn lanes and Traffic Signal - Plan to advertise June 2023. The SR87 at Kenworthy/SR287 at Christensen and SR87 and Skousen Road projects may be advertised together.</li> <li>• SR 87/Keck - This project is to add turn lanes. Kick-off meeting was held on January 2023. Pinal County Maintenance tax sunsets in 2026. Pinal County plans to take it to the voters in 2024. The new Pinal Regional Transportation Plan and 1/2 cents sales tax would go to the voters in November 2025. The Board needs to determine how to remarket plan to the public for the need of maintenance and new roads. Mayor McFarland presented a preliminary 303 Loop concept. However, there has been no discussion at this time with the Pinal RTA Board.</p> <p>Andy Smith with Pinal County mentioned highway numbering are the responsibility of ADOT. Suggested Pinal RTA work w/ MAG, Sun Corridor MPO, and ADOT. Mayor McFarland stated that a meeting with MAG and ADOT is being scheduled to secure numbering.</p>

Andy Smith, Pinal County, asked about ADOT Procurement taking so long and asked about repackaging projects. Irene Higgs stated that she will meet with ADOT Procurement.</p> <p>Work Elements Budget (Estimated vs Actual) for roll-over and Apportionments adjustments. Irene Higgs stated UPWP Amendment #4 was needed to make minor administrative adjustments to the FY2022-2023 UPWP. FY22 - 23 UPWP to CG &amp; MPOs via an apportionment. The yearly HSIP apportionment for SCMPo was \$520,000. In 2018 ADOT changed the HSIP to a competitive process. \$6,240,000 represents the amount of HSIP funding was distributed to CG &amp; MPOs via an apportionment. The SCMPo Region would have received under the apportionment structure through 2025. \$29,398,144 is the amount of HSIP funding that the SCMPo Region has received through 2025.</p> <p>Sun Cloud Overview (15.5) - Irene Higgs stated that the Sun Corridor MPO in partnership with MAG and PAG are developing a web-based tool called "Sun Cloud" to serve as a central transportation data portal for the Sun Corridor Mega Region. The Sun Corridor is made up of Maricopa, Pinal, and Pima counties, along with parts of Santa Cruz and Cochise counties. The data portal will consist of many layers of transportation data which will include: Safety Data, Travel Demand, Traffic Counts, Traffic Analysis Zones, Long Range Plan Projects, Broadband Access, Transit Ridership, Justice 40 Census Tracts, Freight Corridors, ATR1 Freight Data, Pavement Conditions, NEPA, Travel Time Reliability, Disadvantaged Facility Users, and Bridge Conditions. Training is scheduled for Wednesday March 22, 2023 in the Coolidge Council Chambers Training Facility. A demo to the Executive Board will take place at the May Executive Board meeting.</p> <p>Casa Grande used data from the Justice 40 Census Tracts layer that was included in their RAISE grant application.</p> <p>Pinal County Coordinated Mobility Gap Analysis Support Letter (15.6) - Irene Higgs stated that a Letter of Support was provided to CAG for the FTA Grant application for a Pinal County Coordinated Mobility Gap Analysis study.</p> <p>Casa Grande RAISE Grant Support Letter (15.7) - Irene Higgs stated that a Letter of Support was provided for the RAISE Grant Application for the I-10/Kortsen Traffic Interchange in Casa Grande.</p> <p>Pinal County RAISE Grant Support Letter (15.8) - Irene Higgs stated that a Letter of Support was provided for the RAISE Grant Application for the Central Arizona Parkway. A new high-capacity roadway facility that will run west of the CAP canal, the first phase will extend the SR-24 to the CAP Canal and then connect the SR-25 extension south to Occillo Road.</p> <p>Carbon Reduction Program Loan (15.9) - Irene Higgs stated that a loan was done with ADOT for the Carbon Reduction Program. SCMPo received approximately \$117K in CRP funding in May 2022. This is an annual allocation for the next 5-years. SCMPo has not determined how to program this funding, however, we may add scope to the RTP to include the identification of CRP projects and scoping documents.</p>
