SUBJECT: 6.0 Discussion of the Current Update of the Sun Corridor MPO Activities (Information Only):

Status of SCMPO Engineering Program

- **Professional Engineering Services:** We have selected AECOM to provide engineering services for our Engineering Program. NTP is anticipated in the next few weeks. Our 1st task order will be issued to complete traffic counts.
- **Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Funding:** Debriefs have taken place for the 2025 submittals. We will work with the member agencies that want to continue applying for funds for these projects with any future calls for projects from SS4A, Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP), or other eligible funding opportunities.
- **Transit Planning Funds** (5305, 5307, 5310, 5311, 5339) We were awarded \$100,000 for the Eloy Transit Feasibility Study from our 5305 grant application. We are currently working with the City of Eloy on the schedule and solicitation of services for this study.
- **Transportation Alternatives Funding –**
 - FY26 TA grants were awarded to:
 - \$691,691 - Coolidge - Regional Park Walking Trail Project
 - \$996,751 - Casa Grande – West Viola Street Multiuse Path Project
 - \$305,000 - Sun Corridor MPO – City of Eloy Safe Routes to School Study
 - The next call for projects is anticipated to be February 27, 2026.
 - There is approximately \$11M available in FY27, \$14.7M in FY28, and \$6M in FY29.

1. ADOT FY27-31 Tentative Five-Year Construction Program: The final FY27-31 planning level scoping meeting for projects in the tentative program have recently been completed.

2. ADOT 2055 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP): The new ADOT LRTP 2050 listening tour kicked off at the Rural Transportation Summit in October. Feedback was provided from area representatives to pick a time period to meet with the MPO and the participating government agencies. As part of this listening tour – meetings will be one on one to discuss transportation priorities & challenges, with the agencies in Fall 2025/Spring 2026, and the general public beginning in Summer 2026. Please contact the ADOT PM Jennifer Hobert with any questions.

3. Transportation Alternatives: The FHWA funding authorization request was recently approved for the Eloy Safe Routes to School study. The assigned ADOT PM for the final design/construction sidewalk project on Battaglia Road project will also have to complete the ADOT internal processes and IGA for funding authorization. A recent TA TAC was held in Nov. to select the remaining FY 27 projects. The last call for FY29 projects will occur in February 2026. Please visit the TA Program website for detailed information, program guide and application. <https://azdot.gov/TA>.

Status of ADOT studies:

1. Phoenix-Tucson Intercity Passenger Rail Study: Recent updates from FRA have expressed that they anticipate issuing a NOFO by the end of this year for Step 2 of the services development grant. If the NOFO is issued then it'll likely take a couple months to get the grant agreement executed and funding obligated to formally kickoff the project in early 2026. The quarterly meeting that was planned for Nov. 12 was canceled due to the pending NOFO for Step 2 of the Corridor ID program.

The next meeting with the Executive Leadership Team including the MPO directors is scheduled for January 20, 2026.

2. N/S Corridor Segment Tier 2 Study (Southern Segment): Field work and data collection is ongoing (biological, cultural resources, land use development, travel demand modeling,
