5	Discussion of the Legislative Reports on Current Legislation by the Regional Transportation Advocacy Council (RTAC) (Information Only)		

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<p>Ilene Higgs provided the following update:</p> <p>Ilene stated that Kevin Adam has left RTAC for a new opportunity with NADO (The National Association of Development Organizations). Tom Dorn with the Dorn Policy Group has been hired to lead RTAC through this legislative session. There is a transition committee that has been put into place. Ilene stated that she is serving on this committee. The committee is looking at restructuring RTAC. RTAC is currently a department of MACOG, not an independent entity. The committee will be providing 3 options to the RTAC Board (County Supervisor Associations, League of Cities and Towns, and a stand-alone agency) in March/April. The committee is also rewriting the job description for the RTAC Director position. It has not been updated in over 20 years. The committee will work towards hiring a replacement for Kevin. The goal is to have a new Executive Director on board by the Transportation Policy Summit in October 2026.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HB2304 – RTAC Project Priority - Passed unanimously in the Transportation Infrastructure Committee – moving to budget. • HB2760 – AZ SMART - Passed unanimously in the Transportation Infrastructure Committee - moving to budget. • HB2273 – Pinal RTA - Amended by Rep. Olsen as a one-time individual income tax rebate. Requires ADOR, between October 15, 2027, and November 15, 2027, to issue a one-time \$300 individual income tax rebate to an Arizona taxpayer whose primary residence was located in Pinal County during TYs 2018 through 2024 and who filed a full-year resident tax return for TY 2026. • HB2400 – Motor Fuel Tax Holiday – \$1.4B hit to HURF over 20 years • BASICS Act - (Bridges And Safety Infrastructure for Community Success) Act: New Transportation Bill <p>Fixes bridges based on condition and ownership Delivers local and regional priority projects faster Targets safety dollars to high-risk roads Strengthens accountability and local project selection Builds planning capacity to deliver better projects faster Provides support for rural transportation planning organizations Protects local and regional dollars from being transferred away</p> <p>Ilene stated that the Executive Board may want to provide a letter of support for the BASICS Act as it moves forward.</p>

<p>Eloy Safe Route to School Study - The Sun Corridor MPO was awarded \$295,000 by ADOT via the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) to conduct a Safe Routes to School Study for the City of Eloy. The MPO received 10 proposals. The Consultant Selection Committee met on Thursday, March 5th to review scoring and select a consultant. The Consultant Selection Committee selected Kimley-Horn. SCMPO staff is working on the DRAFT Professional Services Agreement (PSA). It is expected to take a couple of weeks to negotiate the contract. Once the PSA is signed and executed, the Notice to Proceed (NTP) for the study will be sent to Kimley-Horn.</p> <p>Eloy Transit Feasibility Study - The Sun Corridor MPO was awarded \$94,300 in federal funding for a Transit Feasibility Study for the City of Eloy via the ADOT 5305(e) Transit Planning Program. The scope of work includes the evaluation and assessment of the City's transit needs, development of three alternatives, implementation strategies, and final costs. Approval to advertise, negotiate, and select a consultant for the transit study is on today's agenda. The Request for Proposals (RFP) is expected to be released in April.</p>
<p>7</p> <p>Discussion of the Current Updates of the Pinal County Air Quality Activities (Information Only)</p> <p>Jason Botjten provided the following update for Pinal County:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SCMPO December 2025 Air Quality Conformity On January 8, 2026, the Finding of Conformity notice was received from FHWA & FTA. On January 12, 2026, the STIP Amendment request was submitted to ADOT. The December 2025 Air Quality Conformity cycle is complete. • SCMPO June 2026 Air Quality Conformity All updated June 2026 Air Quality Conformity project lists were received from the TAC. The compiled Sun Corridor MPO Region Project List was sent to MAG to start coding and modeling on December 9, 2025. The 30-Day Public Review and Comment Period is scheduled for April 23 to May 23, 2026.

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<p>Will Randolph provided the following update:</p> <p>1. ADOT FY27-31 Tentative Five-Year Construction Program : On February 20, 2026, the State Transportation Board (STB) approved the tentative program to proceed with the spring public comment period. Comments can be submitted online, email, phone. The STB will review the tentative program in March, then the public hearing with the STB will occur in May, with June adoption.</p> <p>2. ADOT 2055 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) : The listening tour meetings are occurring with the local agencies around the state. As part of this listening tour, meetings have been one-on-one to discuss transportation priorities & challenges, with the agencies in Fall 2026/Spring 2026, and the general public beginning in Summer 2026. After today's listening Tour presentation, the next session will be in Florence on April 2, 2026, from 1:00-3:00 pm.</p> <p>3. Transportation Alternatives : The FY27-29 call for projects occurred on February 27, 2026. An informational webinar was held on March 9, 2026. Local agencies are currently working with ADOT PMs for TA projects in the region to process IGAS so the projects can be federally authorized. Please visit the TA Program website for detailed information, program guide and application. https://azdot.gov/TA.</p> <p>4. Phoenix-Tucson Intercity Passenger Rail Study : The PM is still standing by to hear if the NOFO will be released this Spring for Step 2 of the services development grant. If the NOFO is issued then it'll likely take a couple months to get the grant agreement executed and funding obligated to formally kickoff the project in early 2026.</p> <p>The next meeting with the Executive Leadership Team including the MPO directors is tentatively to be scheduled.</p> <p>Project Website: azdot.gov/PhoenixTucsonPassengerRail</p> <p>5. N/S Corridor Segment Tier 2 Study : Biological field investigations are complete, and protocol surveys will be completed in the Spring. The Class III cultural resources survey are nearly complete, and ongoing cultural surveys will include agricultural areas. All cultural surveys are anticipated to be complete in early 2026. Traditional Cultural Places interviews are ongoing with the Four Southern Tribes and the Pasqua Yequi Tribe. Section 404 (Clean Water Act) field work is complete and initial reports drafted. Hydrologic modeling is underway for major river and drainage crossings. Recent meetings were held with the cooperating agencies, and we have sent the purpose and need to review by the CA's via workfront. There will be continued bi-weekly core team meetings and project coordination with government agencies and stakeholders.</p> <p>Please visit the project website for any other needed information. https://azdot.gov/north-south-corridor-study-proposed-new-transportation-route-pinal-county</p> <p>6. ADOT Route Transfers Study : Kimley Horn was selected as the consultant to update how ADOT conducts transferring state routes to local ownership, or transferring local routes to state ownership. The ADOT route transfer handbook update will modernize the previous guidelines from 2012 on the process to conduct route transfers, and will identify potential candidates. The TAC Kickoff recently occurred and valuable input was provided for stakeholder interest and contacts. Invites to local agency stakeholders will be sent soon for virtual sessions to interview up to 50 interested stakeholders. The last update was in 2012.</p>
